



Introduction of an Alternate School Year

Submission date for Proposed Alternate School Year Calendars is **March 31st**. Submissions are delivered to the Superintendent, or designate, for review prior to presenting to the Board for approval.

5.	The adoption of an Alternate School Year has no impact on other schools in the jurisdiction. <i>(If yes, then check 5.1.1 to 5.1.2c. If no, proceed to 5.2).</i>
5.1.1	The proposal has originated with the School Council
5.1.2a	The proposal is supported by 80% or more parents – as determined by a survey conducted by the school and school council
5.1.2b	The proposal is supported by 80% or more students (grades 4-12) – as determined by a survey conducted by the school and school council
5.1.2c	The proposal is supported by 80% or more staff – as determined by a survey conducted by the school and school council

5.2.1	The proposal has been developed by the school administration in collaboration with board and system administration.

5.4	A calendar has been developed ‘in principle’ which aligns with the conditions described in Form 6-5-B.
