He develops a 16-page survey that he is convinced will help him find the perfect partner. This quirky comedy is all about what happens when Don's scientific survey doesn't work quite the way he had planned, and the foul-mouthed barmaid Rosie Jarman walks into his life. This novel is all about the magical, messy, and painfully winding path toward love.

TUESDAYS WITH MORRIE by Mitch Albom

Have you ever had that one person in your life who cared enough to listen to you, mentor you, help you find your way? Perhaps for you it was a coach or a parent, maybe even a brother, a sister, or a friend. For Mitch Albom, the person was Morrie Schwartz, his former college professor. Mitch hasn't seen Morrie in almost 20 years, but when he learns his beloved professor is dying, Mitch commits to visiting Morrie every Tuesday, just as he did those many years ago. Even after all these years, Morrie still has a great deal to teach Mitch... and anyone else who will listen. This moving true story will remind you of the power we have to impact one another's lives.

THE ART OF RACING IN THE RAIN by Garth Stein

Told from an aging dog's point of view, *The Art of Racing in the Rain* follows the lives of the Swift family: Denny, an aspiring race car driver; Eve, Denny's wife who experiences a sudden illness; and Zoe, their three-year-old daughter. Enzo believes that he will be incarnated as a human in his next life and thus spends his days learning about the human condition through his observations, television, and Formula One racing. As a narrator, Enzo is humorous, insightful, and full of wisdom. This novel is both hopeful and heartbreaking and explores the depths of both love and despair.

JUST MERCY by Bryan Stevenson

This memoir focuses on the efforts of the author to free Walter McMillian, an African-American man who was sentenced to the death penalty for the murder of a white woman despite overwhelming evidence of his innocence. Stevenson details McMillian's case to highlight the biases and racial prejudices in the American justice system but also explores the founding of the Equal Justice Initiative and its call for prison sentencing reform. *Just Mercy* examines social justice, poverty, racism, and the need for mercy in our society.
